
The generosity of the congregation to open up the building to those that have need of a place to meet is greatly appreciated throughout the community!!

#### **Bringing Joy to Others**

We are coming up on that time of year where we are all looking for opportunities to share Christmas joy with others in our community. Due to staff changes at Project Starburst, we are not able to conduct the Red Tag project this year, but we do have an alternative!

#### We have a new partnership for 2024 - Mission Point Residents

We want to make sure that every resident at Mission Point receives some of that Christmas joy. Church members are asked to shop for small gifts that can be distributed to the residents at Mission Point. Our goal is 70 individual gifts - 35 for men and 35 for women. Tags are provided in the Narthex with a sign-up sheet to indicate which tags are taken. Only one gift is needed per tag. A list of suggested items is also provided to assist shoppers. Gifts will need to be returned by Sunday, December 15, wrapped with



<u>Suggested items:</u> For men - hats, gloves, wallets, cologne/lotion, electric razors, flannels. For women - hats, gloves, nice scarves, perfume/lotion, jewelry (earrings, bracelets), flannels.





The Toys for Tots box is also available in the Narthex for those who feel the need to shop for and donate a toy. Other opportunities for giving exist throughout the community including the Salvation Army "Angel Tree" project.

October was instant rice packets month. The church members were so generous with donations of single serve rice pouches/boxes, peanut butter, jelly, cereal, soup, pasta noodles, and canned vegetables.

Stuffing mixes are being collected for November. An update will be provided next month but the bin is filling and the generosity continues!



And the "Give to the Pantry" program has identified <u>sweet potato / potato mixes</u> as the "food of the month" for December. Potatoes makes a nice addition to any meal and wonderful to include with every order. So as demand increases, so does the need.
